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cized and threatened to withhold funds from WiredWest's plan, resulting in the regional group transforming itself into a network operator. To continue participating in WiredWest, Tolland would have had to string the fiber lines itself, Donovan said, and the town government would be responsible for any future maintenance or repairs.

"We were going to own the network," Donovan said. "For owning the network, there's a lot of responsibility."

Maintenance-related costs alone would have required monthly subscriber fees of \$75 or higher, Donovan said. Adding the cost of the Internet connec-

tion — the one component that WiredWest was willing to provide — would make the monthly cost \$120 to \$130.

Instead, it makes more sense to contract both the construction and the operation and maintenance of the network to a private company that can do it for less money, Donovan said. Tolland banded together with Monterey, New Marlborough and Sandisfield to seek bids on a four-town project. Frontier Communications, which operates several fiber-optic networks in Connecticut and has a hub in nearby Winsted, Conn., presented a unique opportunity that did not require any up-front borrowing by the towns.

Frontier will make use of state grant funds originally designated for WiredWest. In Tolland, those

funds amount to about \$830,000. Donovan said he had already checked with the state government to make sure those grants can be used by a private company connecting to an out-of-state hub.

Frontier estimates it would take up to three years to build a fiber-optic network in town. Much of that time will be spent in preparation work, such as negotiating with utility pole owners — the telephone and electric companies — to string fiber-optic lines.

How the \$30 per household will be assessed has yet to be determined. Donovan suggested that a \$30 surcharge could be added annually to property tax bills for every dwelling with a certificate of occupancy. Town Treasurer Margaret McClellan,

on the other hand, said it would be fairer to pool the \$30 charges and divide them on a valuation basis among all property taxpayers — essentially, treating it as a tax increase.

Residents would not be able to opt out of the \$30 fee. They could choose not to hook up to the free Internet service, but could not choose not to pay for it.

Like the original WiredWest plan, the Frontier proposal would include the installation of fiber-optic lines as far as the outside of a dwelling, up to 500 feet from the road. The homeowner would be responsible for any wiring and routers inside the home, or any distance beyond 500 feet.

The basic service provided by Frontier would have 12 Mbps

download speeds and no data limit. Donovan said additional services would likely be charged similar rates to Frontier's Connecticut customers, minus the \$30-per-household fee already paid as part of the tax bill. In Connecticut, Frontier is advertising "Broadband Ultimate" at 24 Mbps for \$39.99 in the first year, \$54.99 thereafter, and a "Broadband Ultimate" package adding a digital telephone with unlimited nationwide calling at \$80 per month. Frontier does offer television service, as well, but does not advertise its prices online.

Representatives from the four towns are negotiating the final terms of the deal with Frontier. Any expenditure of town funds, or addition to tax bills, would require Town Meeting approval.
