

# Howarth's two goals not enough in road defeat

NEW YORK, N.Y. - In their first big test of the summer 2017 season, the New England Mutiny hit the road and traveled south to New York City to take on conference newcomers New York Surf - the amateur affiliate of Sky Blue FC of the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL).

The battle for first place in the UWS East would go the hosts' way as the Surf (2-0-1 East) scored two goals early in each half in the 4-2 victory over the Mutiny (2-1 East) at SUNY Maritime.

New York has been heralded for their defense in their first two matches this season but it was their offense that came firing out of the gates. Midfielder Jordan Clark would put the Surf on the score board first in the eighth minute, blasting her header off a Flo Gamby corner kick off the cross bar and past New England goalkeeper Annie Ulliach (three saves). Five minutes later, forward Erica Murphy maneuvered through the Mutiny defense and beat Ulliach on her 1v1 opportunity for the 2-0 score.

New England would get a goal back before halftime through team captain and leading scorer Kate Howarth. Howarth

notched her fifth goal of the season in the 29th minute as after a New York giveaway, she dodged around the defense and fired a low shot inside the far post for the 2-1 score. The Surf would notch two goals early in the second half to put the game out of reach.

After a cross from the right flank, forward Maegen Doyle would slot her shot inside the left post past Ulliach for the 3-1 score and the eventual game-winning goal. Five minutes later, Doyle would assist on a goal by Furtuna Velaj as her cross found the New York forward wide open on the left flank. Velaj would convert on her opportunity for the commanding 4-1 lead. Howarth would tally her sixth goal of the season for the Mutiny in the 74th minute on a penalty kick.

## Mutiny, Pioneer Valley Storm join forces

"The Pioneer Valley Storm is very excited to be merging with the New England Mutiny," said Pioneer Valley Storm president Shaun Jenks. "The two clubs and their leadership have com-

mon goals and perspectives with a focus on providing high quality training with competitive and challenging games for all. We have created a 'Super Club' opportunity for players and families with many added benefits while keeping the tuition reasonably priced. We are looking forward to providing something special for the soccer players in Western Massachusetts and Northern Connecticut."

"Youth soccer in western Massachusetts has become so confusing and misleading that the needs of the players and their families have been lost," said New England Mutiny owner and general manager Joe Ferrara. "Simply put, this agreement is about partnership and better opportunities for kids by combining the resources and expertise of two like-minded organizations. It provides the opportunity for the top local players, who have traditionally gone outside the region for their soccer education, to stay in western Massachusetts. It will also allow for players who are interested in playing in a fun and competitive atmosphere to maximize their potential."
