South Hadley Police Log: Aug. 21-27

Monday, Aug. 21

Police arrived on scene and found Cournoyer's Ford Escape stuck on a headstone. They learned he had been traveling westbound on Woodlawn Street and failed to stop at the intersection with Pittroff Avenue, driving right into the cemetery. Cournoyer was brought to the police station and later released on his own personal recognizance.

3:38 a.m. - The parents of two 13-year-olds and one 14-year-old were notified after police responded to a report from a Summit Street resident reporting hearing noises like something was being thrown at her house. Police arrived and found the teens in the area. Crab apples found in the area are likely what was thrown at the home. There was no damage.
