The Committee also acknowledged and appreciated the approval given by the Capital Planning Committee for a new scoreboard at the high school.

Principal of South Hadley High School Elizabeth Wood joined, petitioning the Committee to approve a listing of added extracurricular opportunities that will be available to students for the 2024-25 school year. These additions include courses such as a more com-

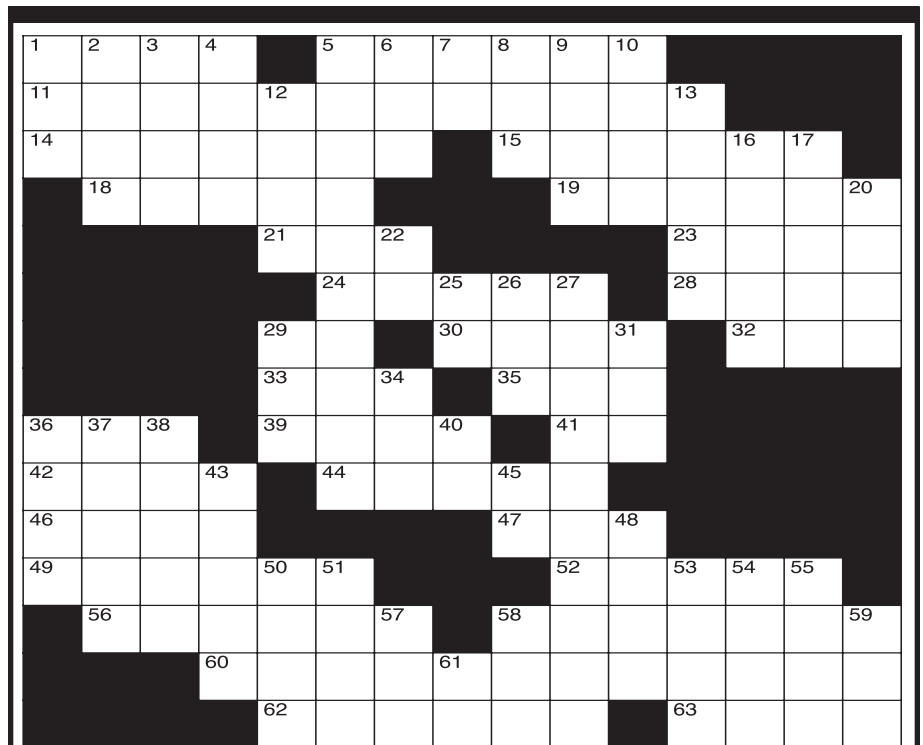
