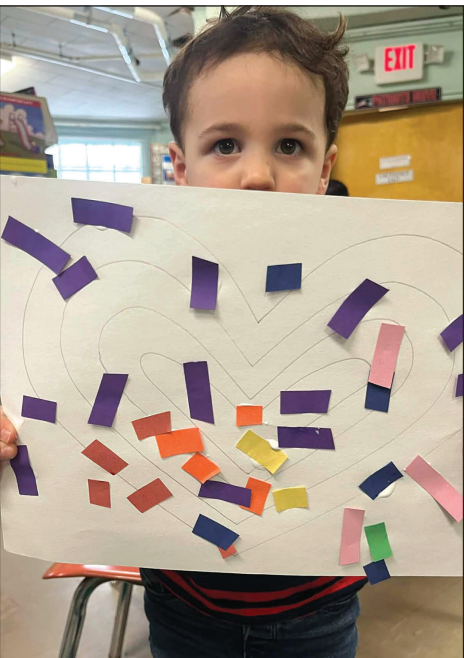

teers transitioned to Mosi-
er School. Still, parent
involvement remains essen-
tial. "Without volunteers,
these events wouldn't hap-
pen," Bartlett said, noting
that continued engagement
is key to sustaining pro-
grams year after year.

The PTA works close-
ly with administrators and
teachers at the Henry J. Ska-
la School to identify needs

and set priorities. Teachers
regularly reach out for help
with supplies or support for
events like field day and
picture day. Ensuring ac-
cess is central to that mis-
sion. "We want all students
to be able to experience ev-
ery event regardless of the
ability to pay," Bartlett said,
adding that scholarships are
available for families with
financial need.

Like many school orga-
nizations, the Skala PTA

faces challenges, particu-
larly rising field trip and
transportation costs. "Bus-
ing cost is extremely expen-
sive," Bartlett said, noting
that providing no-cost field
trips has become more dif-
ficult, along with securing
nursing coverage for trips.

Even so, the PTA re-
mains committed to finding
solutions—and to making
sure no Skala student is left
behind.
